Boys 15-18:

Only 3 strokes separated the top three finishers in the Boys 15-18 division. Spencer Tibbits (Vancouver, WA) held on to win the division after posting two consistent rounds of 78 to finish at 14-over par. JT Bloomer (Boise, ID) finished one shot back of Tibbits. Bloomer was well off pace after an opening day 82, but posted the low round of the division (75) on the second day to claim second place at 15-over par. Will Gretton (Calgary, AB) who was tied for the lead after a first round 77, fell back to third place after a second round 81 and finished the tournament at 16-over par.

Boys 13-14:

Carson Barry (Eagle, ID) jumped out to a two shot lead after posting a very impressive 74 in the first round. He would be able to expand his lead to three shots after another impressive 76 on the second day and would win the division over Markopolo Fullepp (San Diego, CA). Fullepp posted round of 76-77 to finish in second place by only one stroke. AmritPal Singh Kang (Rancho Cucamonga, CA) made a late push up the leaderboard with a second round 76, but would have to settle with a third place finish at 12-over par.

Boys 11-12:

Jackson Kennon (Bandon, OR) posted two very consistent and impressive rounds of 75-74 to win the Boys 11-12 division at 7-over par. Alexander Yang (Newport Coast, CA) finished second in the Boys 11-12 division. Yang struggled the first day, posting an 80 but posted the low round of the tournament, 73, in the second round to capture the second place finish at 11-over par. Mateo Fuenmayor (Beaverton, OR)

rounded out the top three finishers in the division, finishing at 17-over par for the tournament.

Girls 15-18:

Gigi Stoll (Beaverton, OR) would capture her second FCG World Series division title in as many weeks. Last week Stoll won the FCG Las Vegas Championship by one stroke. This week she would take home the Girls 15-18 division by an astounding 19 strokes. Stoll had rounds of 75-76 to finish the event with a 9-over par total.

Finishing second in the division was Bria Jansen (Cochrane, AB). Jansen had also competed in the Las Vegas Championship last week and finished in fourth place. This week her second place finish was made up of two rounds of 85 to finish the tournament at 28-over par. Rounding out the top three in the Girls 15-18 was Anne Bahr (Boise, ID) who finished the tournament at 52-over par.

Girls 13-14:

Two girls competed in the 13-14 division, Victoria Gailey (Tigard, OR) would jump out to a four shot lead on the first day with an 83 and not look back from there, finishing the second day with an 82 and a tournament total of 23-over par. Only falling six strokes shy of a first place finish was Payton Fehringer (American Falls, ID). Fehringer would shot 87-84 over the two days and finish the tournament at 29-over par.

Girls 11-12:

Tannica Porter (Eugene, OR) was the sole participant in the Girls 11-12 division. Porter shot 109 the first day of the event, but shaved 10 strokes off her score on the second day and finished with a 99. Her tournament score ended up at 66-over par.
